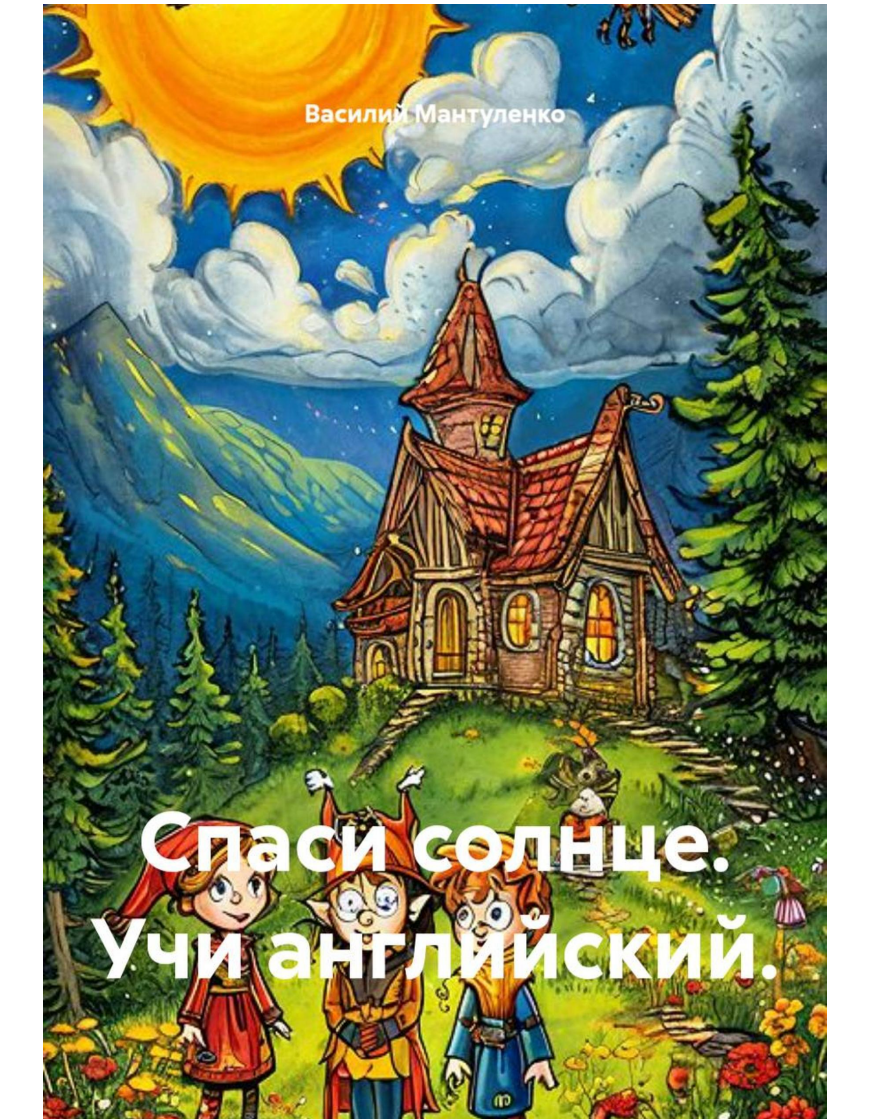

Аннотация

Each of the 15 chapters ends with a short "New Words" box. These are the key vocabulary words from the chapter, with simple English definitions, to help build reading confidence step by step.
