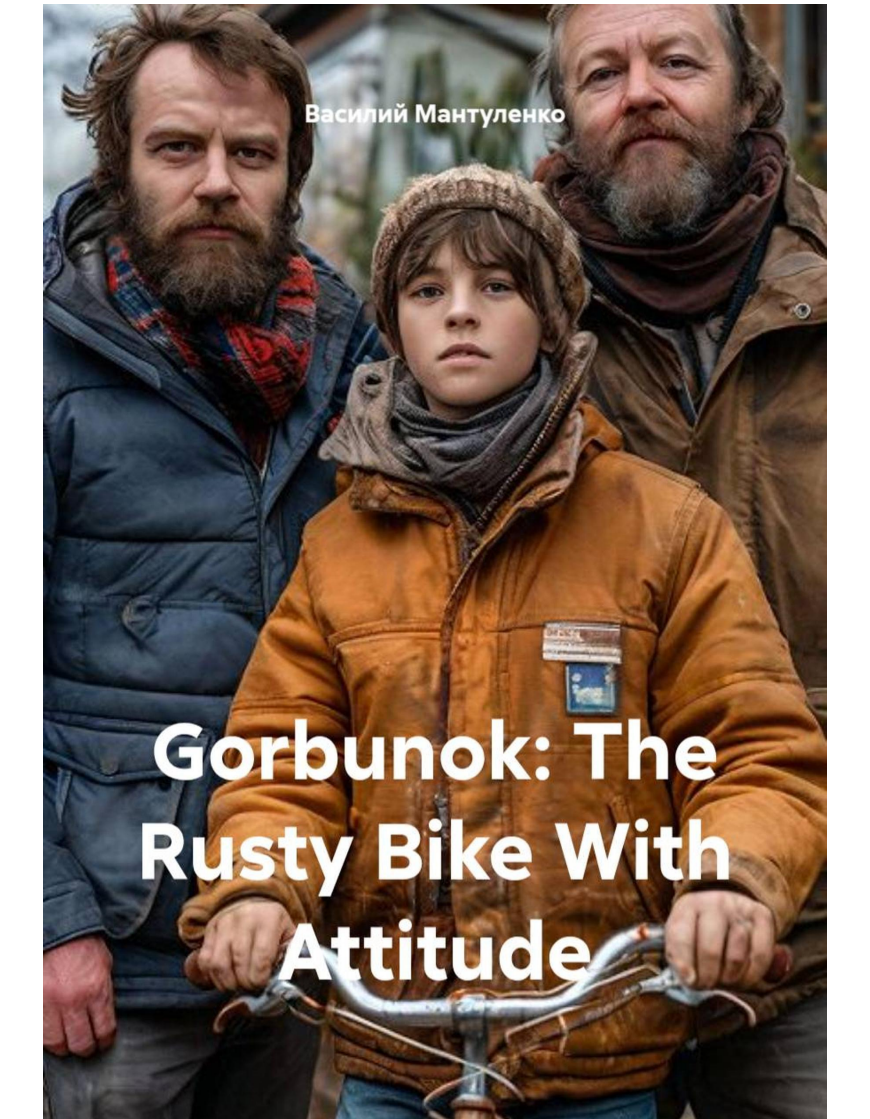

A Note for Teachers and Parents

This story is written in simple, funny English for young learners at level A1–A2. It uses short sentences, everyday words, and plenty of dialogue and jokes, so children can read it aloud and enjoy it in the classroom or at home.

The story is a modern, humorous retelling of the classic tale "Ivan the Fool and the Little Humpbacked Horse" — with a rusty, talking bicycle instead of a magical horse, an online scammer instead of a wicked tsar, and a family fair for tech inventions instead of a royal court.

Each of the 13 chapters ends with a short "New Words" box: key vocabulary from the chapter, with simple English definitions, to help build reading confidence and vocabulary step by step.

The story carries a warm message about not judging others (or things!) by their appearance, and about believing in yourself even when your family or friends don't yet see your worth — a good conversation starter for the classroom or family reading time.

Konstantin Zolotov — a smooth-talking "investor" who is not nearly as honest as his jacket suggests.
